Title I is a federal program that provides supplemental funding to the state and school districts. The funding is for resources to help schools with high concentrations of students from low-income families provide a high-quality education that will enable all children to meet the state's student performance standards.

> All programs must use effective methods and instructional strategies that are grounded in scientifically based research.
